Gary is a senior career officer with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) and has served as Australia's Representative in Taipei and earlier in roles in Australia's missions in Beijing, Shanghai, and Tokyo.

ADVISORY BOARD APPOINTMENT

The Foundation Advisory Board meets three times a year to provide guidance in the Foundation's work to support government, business and communities' constructive engagement with China, consistent with our national interest.

Appointed by the Foreign Minister, Ms Alice Pung OAM is the newest appointment to the Foundation's Advisory Board. Ms Pung is a Melbourne-based writer and lawyer, and an Adjunct Professor at RMIT University's School of Media and Communication. She is the author of the bestselling books that have been published internationally, and translated into Italian, German, Indonesian and Chinese. Her books are studied in schools and universities in Australia and abroad. In 2022, Alice was awarded an Order of Australia Medal for services to literature.

The Foundation is delighted to have the opportunity to work with Ms Pung.

2023-24 GRANTS RECIPIENTS ANNOUNCED

Foreign Minister and Trade and Tourism Minister jointly <u>announced</u> the recipients of the Foundation's 2023-2024 grants round. In total, 27 grants will support a range of activities designed to strengthen cooperation and enhance engagement between Australia and China.

These grants will support Australian industry to re-engage with China in areas of economic importance for Australia, and also support collaboration on climate change, energy, and environment in line with the statement on joint outcomes from the China-Australia Annual Leaders' Meeting.

This grants round is the Foundation's largest for supporting community engagement and people-to-people links. The 2024-25 grants round is planned to be launched in August.

2024 Wang Gungwu Lecture

On 26 February, the Foundation hosted the third Wang Gungwu Lecture in partnership with the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC). Each lecture features a prominent Chinese-Australian and celebrates their life and work and contributions to Australia.

Ms Ming Long AM, a respected business leader and Chair of Diversity Council Australia was the keynote speaker for this year.

"We are at a time of great disruption, from climate change to Al. We cannot continue to operate the same way we have always done. We will need all the talent and diversity in our





community to create the future we need, to create the future we want. We are stewards or our future and our legacy".

Engage with China capability program

Over two days, 27 program participants deepened their knowledge of the Chinese political system, economy and activities in Australia. Australian Ambassador to the PRC Scott Dewar, Group of Eight CEO Vicki Thomson and Director of the ANU Centre for Asian-Australian Leadership Jieh-Yung Lo delivered useful presentations.

The workshop forms part of the Foundation's efforts to promote risk-informed engagement with China in the national interest.

ANU: Australia-China Decarbonisation Roundtable

An Australian delegation led by ANU's Professor Frank Jotzo held an Australia-China Decarbonisation Roundtable in Beijing on 8 May. Supported by the Foundation, the roundtable was a valuable opportunity for Australian Government officials and researchers to hear from key personnel at Tsinghua University involved in developing technologies to reduce emissions, including green steel manufacturing. Australian Newborn Hearing Screening Showcase Program

Macquarie University and the Australian Hearing Hub delivered the <u>Australian Newborn Hearing Screening Showcase Program</u> with the support from the Foundation, to improve early detection and intervention of hearing loss for children in China. In April, a delegation of 14 Australian audiology experts and researchers travelled to Chengdu, Shanghai and Beijing to share knowledge and practices in newborn hearing screening and audiology through a series of workshops, roundtables and site visits.

STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

The Foundation, CEO Gary Cowan visited Melbourne in April to engage with the communities and various state government officials. During his visit, Gary met with Jieh-Yung Lo, founding director of the ANU Centre for Asian Australian Leadership and discussed the ANU's William Ah Ket Leadership Program, which aims to upskill emerging Chinese Australian leaders to be advocates and leaders for their communities. Gary also visited the Museum of Chinese Australian History in Melbourne and spoke with CEO Mr Mark Wang. The Museum established the first nationwide story of the 200-year journey from the first Chinese migrant in 1818 to recent arrivals. The exhibition is a permanent display at the Museum.
